

November 5, 2009

The Mahaska County Board of Supervisors met in special session on the above date at 1:00 p.m. in the third floor conference room of the Mahaska County courthouse. Present were the following board members: Vice chairman – Lawrence Rouw and member – Henry W. VanWeelden. Absent was Chairman – Greg Gordy. Also present was Kay Swanson, Mahaska County Auditor.

Vice chairman Rouw called the meeting to order with a moment of silence.

It was moved by VanWeelden seconded by Rouw to approve the agenda. All present voted aye. Motion carried.

Kay Swanson, County Auditor and Commissioner of Elections reported that there were 9,975 eligible voters on November 3, 2009. 2,111 voted at the polls and 364 voted by absentee ballot.

It was moved by VanWeelden seconded by Rouw to approve the canvass and declare them duly elected to city positions. All present voted aye. Motion carried. Results of the City Elections held in Barnes City; Beacon; Fremont; Keomah Village; Leighton; New Sharon; Oskaloosa; Rose Hill and University Park can be found in the permanent election record book in the Mahaska County Auditor's Office. Keomah Village and Rose Hill will be required to have a run-off election on December 1, 2009.

It was moved by VanWeelden seconded by Rouw to adjourn. All present voted aye. Motion carried.
