

LAST MINUTE CONCERNS FOR ABSENTEE VOTERS

My absentee ballot has finally arrived in the mail. But I'm afraid my ballot won't be received in the election office in time to be counted!

You have several options:

- **Mail your ballot.** It will be counted as long as it arrives in the election office by Tuesday, November 3rd before close of the polls at 8:00 P.M., or it is postmarked no later than Monday, November 2nd **and** arrives in our office by Monday, November 9th, prior to the Election Canvass.
or
- **Personally deliver your absentee ballot** to the county election office. You can take your voted absentee ballot to the election office before 8:00 P.M. on Tuesday, November 3rd. Voted ballots **MUST** be delivered to the auditor's office, either by mail or in person. Voted ballots **CAN NOT** be delivered to your precinct, the ballot will not arrive to the Auditor's Office by the 8:00 P.M. deadline.
or
- **Vote at the polls.** You can take your unvoted absentee ballot with you to the polls and surrender it to the election officials, allowing you to vote in the normal manner. If you forget your ballot or cannot find it, you will be asked to vote a "provisional" ballot, which means that your ballot will be put into an envelope for later consideration.
- I voted early by absentee ballot, but have changed my mind. Can I get my ballot back?
